### Things you may want to know this week

- 1. This Saturday, November 21<sup>st</sup> is the **Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary.** It reminds us of our beloved Presentation Sisters who were with us for years and to thank them for those fruitful years of service to our church. Like Jesus, our Presentation Sisters left us with few disciples, the **Presentation Associates**, 12 of them in our parish. The Presentation Associates are non-vowed persons who continue the work of the Gospel in the light of the charism of the Presentation Sisters and in the spirit of **Nano Nagle**, the foundress of the Presentation Sisters.
