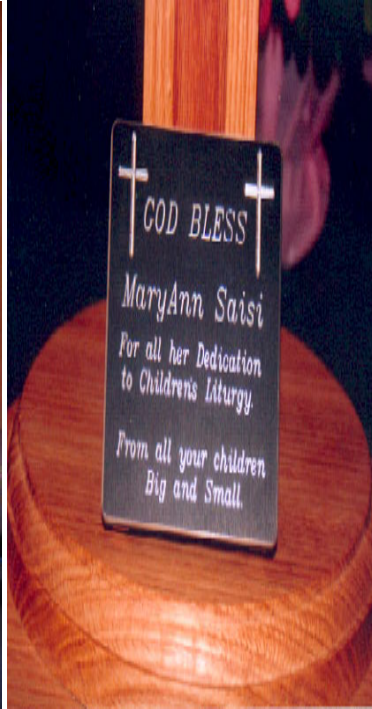

## Third Sunday of Easter

### **Dear Parishioners,**

Today's scripture passage from the gospel of Luke is known as The Road to Emmaus. The two disciples on the road to Emmaus encounter a stranger. They think the stranger is a visitor to Jerusalem. How can this visitor not know of the things that have taken place the past week or so? They are disappointed. Everyone has heard about it. Everyone is talking about it. The news of what has taken place has reached everyone. It is the topic in every conversation. Yet, this one visitor seems unaware of it. The disciples are perplexed and shocked. It is Jesus, though, who is disappointed in his disciples who do not believe what they are talking about. It is one thing to talk about the Resurrection of Jesus. It is another to actually believe Jesus is risen. The disciples' lack of faith prevents them from recognizing that it is the Christ, the Risen Lord, who walks with them on the road to Emmaus.

The two disciples do not ask Jesus to stay with them. Instead, they **urge** Jesus to stay with them. Perhaps this is the key to know who Jesus truly is. We have to urge him to stay with us. The Risen Lord has to be graciously welcomed into one's life, into one's home in order to recognize him. Only by having Jesus in one's life is one able to see clearly that he is in the Word and in the Eucharist. With Jesus staying in our life, he then can break open the Word and the Eucharist. We see him so clearly as the Christ, the Risen Lord in the Word proclaimed and in the Bread broken. He is truly and fully present in these ways.

On whatever road we travel in life, do we urge the stranger Jesus to stay with us? Or do we allow him to walk by us forever not knowing who he truly is and can be for us? He travels on the road of life waiting to be urged to stay with someone. With Jesus staying in our life and in our heart, we come to realize and believe that Christ is Risen. Let us then not waste the opportunity to urge the Christ to stay with us. There is so much that he wants to tell us.

## The Easter Season

The 40 days of Lenten prayer, fasting and almsgiving are followed by 50 days of Easter rejoicing! The first readings on Sundays have shifted from the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) to the Acts of the Apostles, the story of the early Church's triumphs and trials. Written by Luke's community, the various readings we'll hear are full of challenge for us as the modern-day followers of this same Christ, crucified and risen.

Last week's passage describes what the early community saw as essential: "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers." The Word of God was shared by the apostles in the form of stories, orally passed on in extended family groups. The communal life included sharing their property and possessions, "dividing them according to each one's needs." This experience they had had of Jesus radically changed their lives! The breaking of bread was their phrase for what would later be known as the Eucharist and the prayers were probably the Jewish prayers which they had memorized from their families. In the beginning, they had no idea that they were part of a new Church; they continued to pray in the synagogue on the Sabbath (Saturday) and came together on "the Lord's day" (Sunday) as followers of the Way, as it was called.

And what about us? How do we respond to the challenge, the invitation really, from these ancestors in the faith? How devoted are we to the "teaching of the apostles" now so available to us in the Bible, our written scriptures? Our communal life is nurtured by those among us who visit the sick, console the grieving, respond to the needs of the poor, and alert us to the desperation of those miles away from us. We are privileged to partake of the breaking of bread, our Eucharist, weekly or even daily if our schedules and family responsibilities allow, and to participate actively as a choir member, Eucharistic minister, lector or usher. The prayers mentioned could be devotions to Our Lady of Perpetual Help on Tuesdays the family rosary or personal prayer before the Blessed Sacrament any time during the day or on the first Saturday of the month..

How are we doing as parishioners of St. Robert's? What difference has Jesus' life, death and resurrection made in our lives? Many years ago, when I was teaching at St. Francis High School in Sacramento, I taught an elective entitled, "If you were accused of being a Christian, would they find enough evidence to convict you?" This might be a good question to ask ourselves during the coming week. *Peace, S. Sheral*
