Dear Parishioners,

During my freshman year of college, I met an older student who was diagnosed with leukemia. Brett was 20; yet, he approached life knowing that he may not live another year, let alone six months. I visited Brett often to share my freshman insights on how to date and which pizza place was the most reliable to deliver after midnight. All kidding aside, my conversations with Brett led to a friendship that extended beyond his impending death. The same holds true each Sunday when Christ is made present in the proclamation of the Word and in our hearing of the Word.

The Church, in all its wisdom, uses this weekend to commemorate the souls of all the faithful departed. Every Sunday we come together to remember that our final destination is to share in the eternal life with God. To do so, we have to live a life modeled by Christ our Savior. There are many of us who have had grandparents, parents, relatives, teachers, and various role models who have imitated the life of Christ that have come to influence our decision to follow Him so we too can be a model for others. Although some have passed into God's loving hands, we are graced by the living memories that are in each of our hearts.

Somehow it is easier to comprehend death, when a beloved one passes at an older age. Although a loss is painful at any age, a young death causes us to question our faith. Our creed states that we believe in the communion of saints. We can take comfort that our love ones can intercede on our behalf until we come to our promise of everlasting life. During this month of November, take time to reflect on those individuals who have left memories of representing Christ to you.

Jesus is the fulfillment of guiding us to the hope for eternal life that is proclaimed in today's first reading. Like then and now, living a life of sacrifice and service is not understood by the wicked; who in modern terms do not understand God's divine will. As election time comes, there may be some propositions that may or may not be ratified to our disposition. It is at these times that we must continue to carry on with Christ's life, death, and resurrection as our foundation.

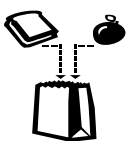


THANKSGIVING FOOD COLLECTION

Living the Liturgy

Our Beloved Dead

When you entered the church, you noticed that we were surrounded by names. These represent the wonderful people who have gone before us during the past year “marked with the sign of faith” as we hear in the funeral liturgy. These are our relatives and spouses and dear friends who are still with us in spirit and interceding for us. Especially when we receive the Eucharist, which many of them received, they are with us as members of the Body of Christ. If we’re not sure they’re in heaven yet, they are, no doubt, on their way to the Communion of Saints! Please bring photos or memorial cards of your beloved dead to place by Mary’s statue for the month.

Our environment, too, reminds us of the cycle in nature of life and death, the fulfillment of the harvest and the fulfillment we will all experience when we are “harvested home” to be with our God forever.

If you are one of those still grieving the loss of a loved one, you might want to reflect on St. Paul’s letter to the Romans 6:3-9 which we hear today. He compares our death and rising to that of Jesus himself. We are so very blest to have the hope of resurrection which our faith gives us!

If we have friends or relatives who have died who weren’t particularly faithful to their Catholic upbringing, we need to recall Jesus’ constant reaching out to those whom everyone else considered lost: the tax collectors, prostitutes, and all manner of sinners. While we don’t want to presume God’s goodness and mercy for ourselves, we surely want to extend it to others.

This season of autumn is a growing time for root vegetables developing in the darkness of the earth with little evidence above ground for what is happening. What might be growing in each of us which isn’t evident yet? Is there a longing for a closer relationship with God? Is it time to deal with a strained relationship we’ve been hoping would improve on its own? Might this be the time to make a conscious effort to let the people we love **know** that we love them?
