Today, as we celebrate the glorious Feast of Pentecost, we picture the apostles and Mary together in one room. They are still frightened and wonder: "What will happen next?" 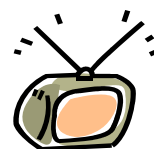

LIVING THE LITURGY

Send Us Your Spirit!

This weekend we celebrate the coming of the Spirit, the culmination of the Easter season. This feast isn't really an ending, but rather a highpoint, since it is traditionally seen as the birthday of the Church, the sending forth of the disciples and ourselves into the world. Imagine the same people who deserted Jesus, huddled together in fear, (and often clueless about the message he had spent three years trying to teach them) transformed into fearless preachers, willing to risk exclusion, torture, even death. It had to be the Spirit! We might recall this first reading from our childhood, since it contains those great images of noise, wind, and fire.

We need to let the reality of this feast sink into us. If someone in our family or among our friends hadn't experienced this fire of the Spirit, would we be Catholic today? Perhaps, you were baptized because it was the custom in your family, but the fact that you're reading this as an adult or a young adult, means you probably "caught" the faith, at least the seed of it, from someone. So who are you going to share that faith with?

We can say, "I'm not the type," "I'm too shy," or "What will I do if they ask me questions I can't answer?" John's gospel promises, "The Holy Spirit...will teach you everything and remind you of all I told you." And anyway, what most people want to know is why you are Catholic, especially in these scandalous times. I'll gladly make recommendations for reading if someone actually asks you theological questions!

Remember how, years ago, we'd hear the phrase, "Keep the faith"? Some of us even grew up with the concept of the "deposit of faith" as if faith were a thing instead of a living, growing relationship with God and God's people. If we listen to today's readings, songs and homily carefully, we'll hear the Spirit's urging, especially today, "Spread the faith!" May the peace Jesus promised be yours! S. Sheral
