The Cross

The readings this weekend are beautiful! Isaiah encourages those in exile by reminding them of the joy they've have when they return to Jerusalem, the center of their faith and symbol of God's presence with them. Paul confronts us with the cross, the center of our faith as Christians and symbol of God's love for us. The cross and the new creation it brings are the only realities that matter to him. Luke's gospel relates the sending out of the 72 disciples in pairs to cure the sick and announce the kingdom of God. He wants them to realize that whatever good they do is from God's power, not their own.

This Fourth of July weekend, as we celebrate our independence, we might thank God for the blessings of fertile soil, natural resources, innovation, possibility and the freedoms we enjoy.
