Dear Parishioners,

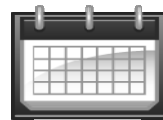
I finally parked at Lunardi's and crossed the street to look at the results of the Sept. 9 fire. It reminded me of what a war zone must look like. Each of us has our own response to that evening and its devastation. Parishioners immediately came to the Rec. Center to volunteer and kept showing up for days just to be present to the evacuees. I saw a family in which each young child brought a favorite stuffed animal to share with a victim of the fire. Mike Larsen, Rose and Bill's son, wrote an article in The Washington Post capturing this same community sense which we've experienced so strongly these days. Everyone has commented on phone calls from friends across the country or around the world, checking to see if they were all right. I've heard from many of you the deep gratitude to God that your home was spared. I've heard relief from others that they only suffered smoke or smoke and water damage. Some of you are, understandably, still afraid to return to your homes and shudder when you hear a fire engine. Others are suffering from "survivors' guilt," wondering why the fire stopped just short of your home. One woman commented that she would give anything to have her neighbors back with their long-beloved homes intact. I received calls, e-mails and cards promising prayers for everyone affected. Friends from Gulfport, Mississippi whom our parish has helped over the years assured me: "You all will continue to be in our thoughts and prayers; we know how long the rebuilding and healing process can take."

My heart goes back to Archbishop Niederauer's homily the day after when he encouraged us to reach out to each other, to actually become the compassion of Jesus for those who are suffering. Aura Jose's singing of "Lean on Me" expressed the same sentiment in different words. The second reading today holds special meaning for us: "God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather of power and love and self-control." We have all been changed by this tragedy. Perhaps, a challenge will be to continue to support each other, no matter how mixed our feelings may be. Those of you who have returned to your homes see the ruin, misery, destruction and violence mentioned in the first reading. *If we need help - financially or emotionally - may we have the humility and the courage to ask for it. Please call us. Trusting in God's presence, may we continue to lean on each other in the coming weeks and months.*

Living Liturgy

Respect Life Month

Each year we celebrate Respect Life Month; actually some places only commemorate it as one Sunday, but there are so many aspects to it, our parish focuses on a different aspect each week. You might recall that nine months ago we were invited by our parish Respect Life group to “spiritually adopt” an unborn baby and to pray for that child and his/her mother each day. Those who participated in this process will be bringing a new unwrapped baby gift to whichever Mass they participate in this weekend. The gifts will be given to the Seton New LifeCenter to distribute to low-income Moms and their babies.

We realize that attitudes toward sexual activity have changed drastically since most of us were growing up. Yet everyone, including our young people, has what psychologists have identified as same basic human needs: to love, to be loved and to feel worthwhile. We’ve all heard of the young woman who gets pregnant in order to have someone love her. If we’re blest enough to have young grandchildren or nieces and nephews or the child of good friends who confides in us, might we reflect on how our relationship shapes that young one’s sense of herself or himself. Can our positive influence help the young persons in our lives to believe in themselves? Can our encouraging their dreams help them to put off sexual activity in favor of a good education or training in the trades? Statistics prove that those with dreams and plans for their future are much less likely to engage in drugs, drinking or early sexual activity. If all young persons hear is that society is “going to hell in a hand basket,” why shouldn’t they live only for the present? Years ago, my older sister taught at a continuation school in Sacramento. She once asked her students what they planned to be doing in five years. She was appalled and saddened that several of them imagined themselves in prison or dead and none of them could identify the possibility of a positive future for themselves. We need to give young people of any age a future to hope in! We need to pass on our experience of God’s presence with us, no matter what the circumstances of our lives, and the faith and trust that God will continue to be with us – and with them – as He promised.

The rose banner is a symbol of the life around us in all of creation. May we nurture life in all the people around us as well – young, old and in between!
