Dear Friends,

I sit here in the peaceful warmth of the sun, surrounded by the beauty of Gene's garden. I slowly sip my mint tea patiently waiting for Gene's white butterfly to appear. Did you know that the butterfly is an Easter symbol of eternal life – a little caterpillar is transformed into a beautiful butterfly – representing Jesus' dying and rising again.

Have you ever asked yourself: "Do I really matter? Do I make a difference?" I just finished reading an inspiring book called "The Butterfly Effect – How Your Life Matters" written by Andy Andrews, in which he speaks of a man, Edward Lorenz. In 1963, Lorenz presented a hypothesis to the New York Academy of Science. His theory was that a butterfly could flap its wings and set molecules of air in motion, which would move other molecules of air, in turn moving more molecules of air – eventually capable of starting a hurricane on the other side of the planet. These scientists scoffed and laughed at Lorenz. Thirty years later, physics professors concluded that the butterfly effect was authentic, accurate and viable. It is now known as The Law of Sensitive Dependence Upon Initial Conditions. Simply said, every word I speak; every move I make; every step I take matters, not just for me; but for all who live on this planet now...and on and on throughout all eternity.

In today's second reading, John says to us: ***Beloved, we are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.*** Jesus was transformed from death to eternal life; we – God's children – like Jesus, shall also live within and beyond our own transformation forever.

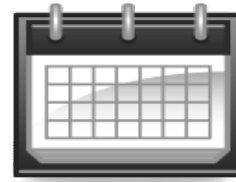
In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us who he is: ***"I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep."*** Just as Jesus (God's Beloved Son) came into this world for a purpose – to lay down his life for us; free us from sin and bring us back to our Father – I too am here – not by accident, but for a purpose – to hear His voice; to come to know and love Jesus. Everything I do matters. I have been created to make a difference. Jesus' Holy Spirit dwells within me. I need only to follow His urgings. As I grow in love, my smile, my touch, my hug, my attentive ear, my words of encouragement and my compassion will bring Jesus' kindness, mercy and love to everyone I meet. Each of them, in turn, will do the same. Little by little -- one love-filled wing-flap at a time – You and I will change the world!

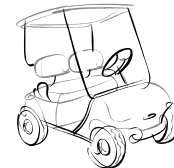
