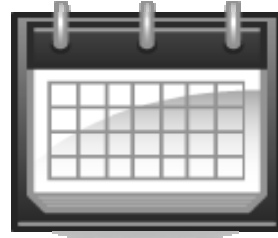

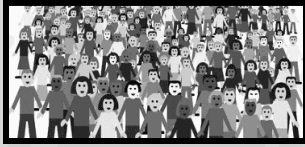

6:30 MASS

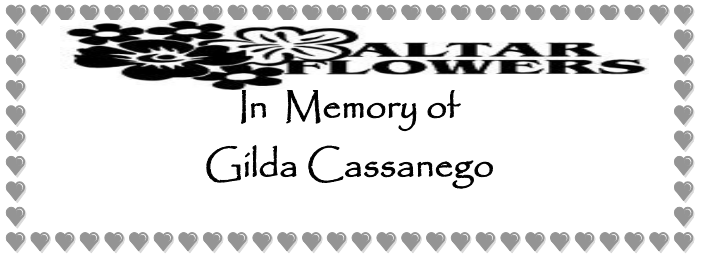
