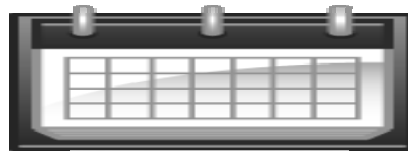
Today's readings sound almost as if they belong in Lent. The first reading exposes the plotting of the wicked against a just person. The second is a reminder that the root of our conflicts and the source of our peace lie within us. The gospel should give hope to us who continue to stumble in our efforts to follow Jesus and his way of life. Even after being with Jesus and witnessing his generosity and compassion for the people, two of the disciples are preoccupied with who will be the greatest in the kingdom! Talk about missing the point of his ministry! Service is the point, Jesus explains. As one theologian puts it: "Loving a child does not offer prestige, honor or wealth; especially in antiquity, the child was generally in the care of mothers, nurses or slaves. This was not the work of a man, certainly not the hand-picked viceroys of the Messiah."

We might add the words of E.J. Dionne, a committed Catholic columnist, who counters those who feel we should not help the refugees flooding into Europe, but instead help our own people in need. "We should never forget our failure to give refuge to more European Jews before they were marched into Hitler's death camps...Of course we should do more for our own citizens...but our failure to help some in need should never be an excuse for refusing to help those facing genuine catastrophe." May God's Spirit guide our leaders to know our nations' role in response to so great a tragedy.

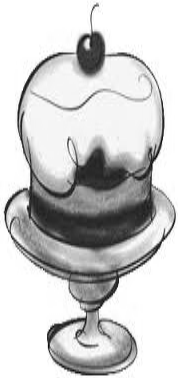
