Dear Parishioners,

Have you ever wondered what it means that we're "made in the image and likeness of God"? I'm not sure when I first heard this phrase or who said it, but I think this weekend's readings provide the answer. In celebrating the Feast of the Holy Trinity, we honor the Father, the Almighty, the Creator of heaven and earth, the one whom our Jewish ancestors in the faith referred to as YHWH, Yahweh, whose name was so holy, it could not be uttered. Jesus Christ, his second name meaning "the Anointed One," we know best since he became human like us, walked this earth and left us much of what he did and said in the scriptures passed on to us. The Spirit is definitely more difficult to imagine! According to Luke's community of believers, the Spirit appeared in "noise like a strong, driving wind" and in "tongues as of fire... which came to rest on each one of them." Also, in the gospel of Pentecost, Jesus promises the Spirit as the one who "will be with you always" and "will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you."

All of John's gospel from chapter 14 through chapter 17 is the clearest description of the Trinity and where we get our amazing understanding that the Father, Son, and Spirit actually lives in us. John 17.21, part of what is referred to as the Priestly Prayer of Christ, Jesus said, "May they all be one. Father may they be one in us, as you are in me and I am in you, so that the world may believe it was you who sent me."

So, our being made in "the image and likeness of God" must mean that we see ourselves as one community with all our differences in age, culture, religion, language, family composition, and national origin. If we're like God who is a Trinity of persons, a community, surely we can't see ourselves as isolated individuals or focus only on our differences. We all share the life of the Trinity and that makes us one at our deepest core.

Items for Catholic Worker

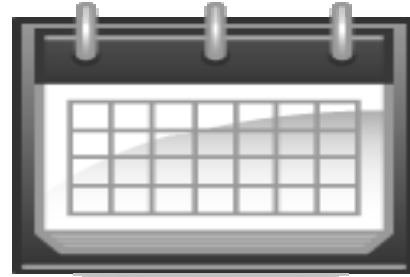
