G.P.'s Music Corner

February 1, 2026

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

One of the great joys of School Mass at Saint Robert is hearing our students sing *Go Make a Difference*. They love the song, and it shows. They sing it with energy, confidence, and conviction, as if they already know the song is not just a melody but a mission. Their voices remind us that the call to holiness is not abstract. It is lived out in everyday faithfulness.

As we enter Black History Month, that call resonates clearly in the life of **Augustus Tolton**. Born into slavery in Missouri in 1854, Tolton and his family escaped to freedom in Illinois during the Civil War. Despite his evident gifts and deep faith, no Catholic seminary in the United States would admit him because of his race, so he went to Rome to study for the priesthood. He was ordained there in 1886 and became the first priest in the United States publicly known to be African American.

Tolton returned to serve the Church in Quincy, Illinois, and later in Chicago, where he built St. Monica's Catholic Church as a center of worship and community for Black Catholics. He ministered with humility, strength, and love in the face of rejection and discrimination, staying faithful to his calling even when it was difficult.

Tolton's cause for canonization is advancing, and he has been declared *Servant of God*. His life exemplifies the very words we sing: to make a difference by living out the Gospel with courage and compassion. If our students' zeal for *Go Make a Difference* reminds us that we are called to be saints in our time, Tolton's witness shows what that looks like in concrete, transformative ways.

May their voices and his example inspire us this month and beyond to always strive to live the song's words cleareyed, joyful resolve.
