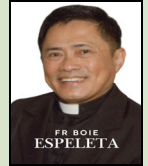

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,
Today is not easy for me.

While parish assignments change, the love, memories, and bonds we have shared will always remain in my heart. When I first arrived as your Associate Priest, I came ready to serve. Along the way, you became much more than parishioners—you became family. We have shared so much of life together: baptisms and weddings, First Communions and Confirmations, moments of healing and grief, funerals and celebrations. We laughed at parish gatherings, festivals, meetings, and simple conversations after Mass.
You welcomed me not only into this parish but into your homes, struggles, stories, and hearts. For that, I will always be deeply grateful. Welcome newcomers, support ministries, reach out to those who feel alone, and keep this parish alive with faith and kindness. Please continue supporting your pastor, parish staff, and ministries. Protect your unity and pray for one another. A parish becomes holy not because of one priest, but because faithful people choose each day to love God and one another. As I leave, know that although I may be transferred, part of my heart will always remain here. I will miss seeing you at Mass, hearing your stories, sharing meals, and walking with you through both joyful and difficult times. Please remember me in your prayers, and forgive me for any moments I may have failed or disappointed you. Everything I tried to do came from a sincere desire to serve God and serve you with love. Though goodbyes are painful, our faith reminds us this is not the end. In Christ, we remain united. Distance may separate us, but prayer keeps hearts close. Thank you for allowing me to walk with you through these unforgettable years. Thank you for loving me, teaching me, and helping me become a better priest.
I leave with gratitude in my heart, tears in my eyes, and hope in my soul. May God continue to bless this parish abundantly. May our Blessed Mother protect each of you. And may we meet again someday, rejoicing in the goodness of God.
